5. Remote Access Scams

Some of the most common scams reported to Action Fraud involve fraudsters connecting remotely to a victim's computer. They will impersonate your internet provider or Microsoft and state that there is a problem and if you allow them remote access, they can then rectify the this for you. However, it is a Scam aimed at stealing your money.

Never allow remote access to your computer following an unsolicited call, text message or browser pop-up.

6. Ticket Fraud

Over £6.7 million was lost to ticket fraud last year across the UK.

Criminals target all types of events and shows, in particular major sporting events. Always be wary of buying tickets from non-reputable sources and only buy tickets from the venue's box office, official promoter or agent, or a well-known and reputable ticket site.

Beware of too good to be true offers.
