## WARNINGS TO RESIDENTS

## **Cold callers are Targeting Kent Residents**

We have received reports of residents in Riverhead, Sevenoaks being cold called by individuals claiming to be part of an ex-offender scheme and selling gardening and household items.

#### How it works:

- Please be aware that ex offenders will <u>never</u> be asked to cold call as part of any ex-offender or prison release scheme.
- Doorstep criminals call on unsuspecting households offering convincing deals to try to get you to agree to have work carried out or buy goods.

#### What to do:

- Do not open the door to the doorstep cold caller.
- Do not trade on your doorstep. Just say No.
- Warn vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours.
- If you need home repairs carried out use reputable traders who are members of the KCC Trading Standards approved trader scheme, run in partnership with Checkatrade
- If you feel afraid or threatened by a doorstep caller, phone 999.

## Holiday Scam

More than 5,000 people were victims of holiday booking fraud last year, their total losses amounting to seven million pounds. Airline and online accommodation were the main targets

#### How it works

- A Kent family booked a villa in Mallorca with a company that also arranged transfers.
- Alarm bells rang when no transfer driver was waiting for them at Palma airport.
- They eventually took a taxi to "their" villa to find out that the property owner did not rent out his home and had no knowledge of their "booking".
- The family eventually found another villa to rent but were now £8000 out of pocket.
- The family's bank is trying to retrieve the money from the fraudster's Spanish bank based in Madrid but there is no guarantee of success.

#### To help protect yourself:

- Check customer reviews review and research thoroughly.
- Look out for companies that are members of professional bodies such as ABTA.
- Be wary of paying a private individual by bank transfer.
- Paying by credit card will offer you much more protection from fraud.
- Trust your instincts, don't get rushed into making impulsive decisions.

#### PRESCRIPTIONS AND OVER THE COUNTER MEDICINES (OTC)

NHS England has published guidance to reduce prescribing medicines or treatments that are readily available to buy over the counter. This means that some medications will no longer be available on prescription, even if you are entitled to free prescriptions. All patients effected by these changes will be notified individually in due course.

Also, if you seek advice from a Doctor for a common condition, such as a cough, cold, sore throat etc. you will be referred to your local pharmacy, where they will be happy to help without the need for an appointment. Obviously, if your symptoms do not improve after a few days you should seek further advice.
