Draft Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held at the Village Hall, Acol on 25th June 2019 at 11.00a.m.

10. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Cllr Reece Pugh (TDC), Liz Hurst (KCC), Debbie Forsyth (PCSO) and Tony Gander (KCC Warden).

11. MINUTES

Approval of the Minutes of the meetings held on 3rd May 2019 was deferred.

12. MEMBERS' INTERESTS

No disclosures were made.

13. REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN

The Chairman reported upon the following:

- (i) Counting strips have been installed in The Street to monitor the effect of the traffic calming and results will be reported when they are received.
- (ii) The village gateway signs have been replaced on Acol Hill.
- (iii) A letter to Kent Highways is being prepared in response to information sent by them.
- (iv) The roof of The Crown & Sceptre building has been reinstated and new window frames have been fitted to the top floor, but work has ceased before completion.
- (v) Kent Fire & Rescue Service are providing a free safety service for all resident

14. REPORT OF THE INTERNAL AUDITOR

The Clerk reported that the internal audit of the Parish Council financial records had been carried out. The Clerk read over the AGAR reports and Members noted and approved the Annual Governance Statement for 2018/19 and noted that the Internal Auditornhad highlighted paragraphs 3 & 5 where it had been noted that the Council had not taken the appropriate action and these measures would be put in place in the near future. Members were also advised that the formal report of the Auditor had not been received and it would be considered as soon as it was to hand. However it would be necessary for the Council to

bring up to date the web site and Ray Owen had kindly agreed to help the Clerk with this project. In addition the formal report may highlight other areas that needed to be addressed and these matters would be considered once the report was received.

Clir Liz Hurst – Street lights have now been converted to LED, resulting in a reduction of 67.7% in energy consumption and 71% in carbon emissions.

PCSO Debbie Forsyth – Acol is relatively crime free, but residents must be vigilant concerning rogue traders, suspicious vehicles, home security, cold calls, etc. She now holds police surgeries at 12.15pm on the first Wednesday of every month at Monkton Village Hall.

COMMUNITY FUND RAISING


Hi everyone!

My name is Vicky Price, I am Neal and Fleur's daughter from 12 Nursery Fields.

Some of you may already know, but for those that don't; my dad had a cycling accident in July 2017 in which he sustained a spinal cord injury and leaving him paralyzed from the chest down. As a very fit and active man this was a huge blow to him and our family.

Although initially he had no sensation or movement, through attending sessions at Neurokinex- a specialist Neuro rehabilitation practice in Crawley, he has been seeing some promising improvements.

He attends one hour of activity-based rehab and one of electronic stimulation a week which has been improving his strength, reawakening nerve pathways and is generally working to give him back some independence.

We are very keen for him to continue attending these sessions, but they are very expensive and not something that would be available on the NHS. To this end, myself and a friend will be taking part in the National Three Peaks Challenge to aim to raise funds for 10 weeks of physio. In addition, we would love to make a donation to Neurokinex's charitable trust to help others to access this amazing practice.

The Challenge is to complete climbing Ben Nevis, Scafell Pike and Snowdon...hopefully in 24 hours! Now three mountains in three countries in 24 hours is no mean feat...so if you would like to help encourage us and aid my dad's recovery, we would be forever grateful!

Luckily we were joined by my 10 year old grandson, Harry, 8km from the end when he insisted on taking my rucksack, which was good. He also helped my son Jim carry on after problems with blisters and his diabetes. Anyway we completed it.

For several days afterwards my feet refused to communicate with my brain and the legs didn't help by declining to convey any messages. There were parts of my body which I hadn't heard from for several years suddenly reminding me of their existence! After a few days things are gradually returning to normal. Did I enjoy it? Well it was hard so not really. Was it worth it? Without any doubt YES.

For me and for Jim (more used to two pedals) it was an achievement. The crews of Pilgrims Hospice who marshalled the route and manned the stops were brilliant, all being very supportive and appreciative of everyone's efforts.

The main point is that so far I have raised in excess of £500. All this is for the **Pilgrims Hospice**. (£52 was for Harry's part). With Jim it will be in excess of £1000.

WARNINGS TO RESIDENTS

Doorstep Crime - Roofing Scam

We have received reports of a roofing scam

How It Works

- A brick is thrown onto resident's roof, causing damage to tiles
- A criminal knocks onon the door, offering to repair the damage

What to do

- NEVER agree to work from someone who knocks on your door uninvited
- DON'T allow anyone to pressure you into having work done
- If you ask then to leave and they don't, contact the police on 999
- Use reputable traders who are a member of the KCC Trading Standards approved trader scheme, run in partnership with Checkatrade
- If your roof is damaged, get a minimum of 3 quotes in writing

If you have an External letterbox - beware

Mail can provide fraudsters with a lot of the information they need to commit a crime of fraud or identity theft. It is also reasonably easy to intercept someone's mail, especially if they have an external mailbox.

What happens

- The criminals search an area for external letterboxes and steal documents such as bank statements.
- They check the electoral roll or search online for further information to apply for multiple credit cards in the resident's name
- When the cards arrive, the criminal collects them from the external mailbox.

What to do

- Make sure your letterbox is secure and cannot be accessed by anyone else or install an anti-theft letterbox
- Empty your letterbox regularly
- If you have been a victim of this type of crime call Kent Police on 101
