ACOL PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the meeting of Acol Parish Council held in the Village Hall, Acol, on Monday 26th July 2021 at 11.00am.

Present: Councillors Miss Bransfield (Chairman), D Hayfield. J. Inchley and Mrs. Osborne.

Also in attendance: Roy Wade (Clerk/RFO) and 3 residents.

8. MINUTES

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the meetings held on 18th January and 8th June 2021 be approved and signed by the Chairman.

9. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

No apologies for absence were received.

10. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No disclosures of interest were made.

11.CO-OPTION TO PARISH COUNCIL

The Clerk reported a notice of the vacancy on the Parish Council had been displayed on the Village Notice board and the website inviting residents to apply for co-option to the Council. One application had been received.

RESOLVED: That a report be submitted to the September meeting for Members to consider and approve the filling of the vacancy on the Parish Council.

12. REPORTS OF THE POLICE/COMMUNITY WARDENS/PCSO'S

No officers were in attendance to report.

13. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman reported upon the following matters which had arisen since the last meeting:-

- The Community Playback Scheme asked for villagers to suggest ways in which they could be of use in Acol.
- Parish Council is considering ways in which a new fence could be financed and fitted to the south of the Recreation field. Questions were asked concerning the responsibility of the fence and I will check our Lease with Quex Estates.
- TV News companies had been emailed with information about our traffic problems and BBC News have acknowledged receipt. This will be followed up.
- Parish Council has completed an on-line form to request replacement dogwaste bin, with no response to date.
- Explained the fact that Serco disbanded all ground maintenance in Thanet without notifying us, hence the overgrown grass. Arrangements are being made to clear it and engage an alternative permanent contractor.
- I recently met Sarah Osborne, Community Development Officer, who works with young people and veterans in order to bring them together. It was agreed that we will invite her to our September meeting to discuss her work.
- Volunteers have offered to repaint the direction sign on Nursery Fields. Several years ago, we asked Highways to repair and repaint it and we were informed that they could only replace it with a modern street sign. Obviously we refused as we wish to retain the village's heritage so it now belongs to us. The late Bob Lawrence was intending to repaint it but, since his sad loss, it was forgotten.
- The whole village is extremely grateful to our valuable volunteers who jump up to attend to so many problems within the village.
- We are grateful to Quex Estates for their direction signs for last weekend's event, directing traffic away from Acol.
- Thanet District Council has recently asked about Acol's Emergency Plan.
 This has been discussed many times over several years and The Chairman will check the details to report at the next meeting.

14. VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE - DONATION

The Clerk was pleased to report that the Acol Village Hall Management Committee has generously donated £3,500 to the Parish Council.

RESOLVED: (A) That the donation be gratefully accepted and the Village Hall Management Committee be thanked; and

(B) the donation be used to part fund the improvement of the play area (recreation Ground) and the purchase of play equipment.

15. RECREATION GROUND - PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

Councillor David Hayfield reported on proposals for the improvement to the Recreation Ground and suggested that the generous donation from the Acol Village Hall Management Committee could be used to purchase a roundabout and meet the cost of installation.

RESOLVED: That the proposal of Cllr. Hayfield be approved in principle and that he report to the September meeting on the detailed costings of the purchase of equipment and installation.

16. GRASS CUTTING - THE RECREATION GROUND

The Clerk reported that Serco has withdrawn from the operation of grass cutting maintenance from the Thanet area. Arrangements have been made

for the grass to be cut and the children's play area to be strimmed. There was a discussion on a claim that the Recreation Ground had not been cut in June or July and Karen Ault had photographic evidence to support this which she would send to the Clerk.

RESOLVED: The Parish Council's concerns be forwarded to Serco and they be requested to refund those payments made in respect of grass cuts not carried out.

17. CLERK'S REPORT

Annual Audit. The clerk reported that the Council's audit papers had been put on the website and notice boards, advising residents that they were available for inspection. No residents had asked to view the papers and the Auditor had been advised accordingly.

- (b) Village Hall: The Management Committee had agreed to provide a wi-fi facility in the Village Hall to make it even more attractive to hirers of the Hall.


21.SPEEDWATCH

COVID-19 VACCINATION PROGRAMME - UPDATE

The Vaccination programme will continue to be rolled out at the SAGA Centre in Westwood Cross throughput September and October.

Vaccinations are now available to <u>all 16/17 years old</u> with the majority being offered and already received their Vaccination, so if you have not had yours, please contact the surgery or visit the walk-in clinic on Saturdays.

<u>Booster vaccines:</u> All eligible Patients will receive an invitation, approximately midSeptember, to receive the vaccine, which, at this moment in time is likely to be the Pfizer vaccine

<u>Winter Flu vaccine</u> All patients over 65 and those considered to be venerable and at risk will receive an invitation from the surgery to receive the Vaccination and messages are already being sent out to enable ordering and clinics to be planned. The practicality of giving both Vaccinations at the same time is also being considered. Further up to date information can be found on the following website and on our
