That Wednesday morning (the day of the Ploughing Match) was a nightmare for traffic, and clearly some emotions were running very high. However, the Village Hall is NOT open to the public during a hiring, and <u>nobody</u> has the right to burst in and harangue elderly ladies attending a MacMillan Coffee Morning and sewing class, whether they had parked improperly on private property or not. This is as much a trespass as the parking which so exercised you.

To compound that by not introducing yourself or explaining by what right you think you can upset a room full of people is inexcusable.

The ladies you vented your spleen upon have been visiting Acol on a fortnightly basis for some years, but were entirely unaware that part of Nursery Fields is a Private Road (has the Residents Committee thought of erecting some signage beside the road to make this more apparent?). Having fought their way through the traffic they just saw some parking spaces and took advantage of them - this was not some Machiavellian plot to upset the residents of Nursery Fields, whatever you may have believed in your over-wrought state at the time.

A polite knock on the door, a simple introduction, and a polite explanation would have avoided quite unnecessary distress - the ladies were more than happy to move their cars once they understood the situation.

Similarly, whoever was responsible, the scrawled note and implicit threat contained therein (your details have been noted) was unpleasant, offensive and did the residents of Nursery Fields no credit. Whatever happened to good manners and community spirit?
