Covid-19 VACCINATION PROGRAMME - UPDATE:

With the closure of the SAGA building in Westwood Cross, it has been necessary to relocate the Vaccine Centre, which can now be found adjacent to "Wickes Building Supplies" and "Curry's Electrical Store" and will be called "Thanet (Broadstairs) Vaccination Service (LVS)

The new centre will be open every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from 8am to 5pm

- Booster Jabs are now available for everyone over 18 but please remember there must be 3 months since your second Vaccination.
- Older teens aged 16-17 are now eligible for a second dose but must be at least 12 weeks after their first
- Those aged 12-15 are now also eligible for a second does after 12 weeks.

Not had yours yet? There are still many eligible patients who are unvaccinated and many others who have not yet had two vaccines or even their Booster, so don't wait until it's too late! You can still get seriously ill with Covid or worse - infect others!

"FACE-TO-FACE" appointments

Patients will continue to receive a telephone consultation from a doctor before being offered an appointment with the relevant healthcare professional. Currently **62%** of patients are receiving a Face-to-Face appointment where necessary.

PLEASE NOTE it will still be mandatory to wear Face Masks when attending the Surgery.

ACOL PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the meeting of Acol Parish Council held in the Village Hall, Acol, on Monday 17th January 2022 at 11.00am.

Present: Councillors Miss Bransfield (Chairman) Hayfield, Inchley, Mrs. Osborne and Mrs. Winpenny.

Also present: Cllrs. Crow-Brown (KCC), Ms. Abbi Smith (TDC), Roy Wade (Clerk) and 6 residents.

- 45. MINUTES RESOLVED: That the minutes of the Meeting held on 8th November 2021 be approved and signed by the Chairman.
- 46. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE No apologies for absence were received.
- 47. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST No disclosures of interest were made.
- 48. REPORTS OF THE POLICE/COMMUNITY WARDENS/PCSOs No officers were in attendance to report.
- 49. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Chairman reported upon the following matters:

- 1. Missing dog-waste bin Cllr. Ms. Smith undertook to refer to TDC the question
- of the emptying of the waste from dog bins.

2. Community Payback Scheme. The Covid pandemic has delayed many things and no ideas have yet been suggested. Further enquiries will be made.

3. Persistent rain has caused the verges and hedges abutting Acol's narrow lanes to continue overgrowing. Perhaps owners of the private properties would be willing to allow the Community Payback Team to attend to the problem.

4. Highways have arranged to reduce the height of traffic calming humps between Plumstone Road and Dilnot Lane. Acol Parish Council has been campaigning against the largest hump, in the centre of the village, since it was built in 2018, with no response. There are several residents living near the hump, some whose exit is directly on to the road, but Kent Highways continue to refuse the extension to Columbus Avenue. The Manston Business Park continues to increase and much of the construction and delivery traffic uses Acol. The TDC Local Plan clearly stated that commercial companies moving into the Business Park would have to contribute towards the cost of improved infrastructure.

5. Acol Parish Council has requested another monitoring of traffic volume and Cllr Derek Crow-Brown offered to pay for the cost.

6. Queen's Jubilee mugs. Purchase of a box of mugs had been approved at the previous meeting and ordering them is in hand.

7. It was suggested using the Community Payback Team to repaint the basketball and goal posts.

8. Village Hall – Cllr. Inchley reported that a defibrillator had been placed in the Village Hall and that the Management Committee had donated £850 to the Parish Council for the annual cost of providing and maintaining it.

9. Richard Steel gave an update on the Speedwatch initiative and advised that he would be attending the meeting of the TRRG to try to get a wider representation for the parishes on Speedwatch. He outlined the effectiveness of speed guns and the need to acquire more of them. Council was also advised that he was trying to get PCSOs more involved in the initiative. Finally, Richard is to send details of the Speedwatch initiative to Cllr. Mrs. Winpenny.

10. Volunteers within the village were recognition and thanks were expressed for their efforts.

11. Neighbourhood Watch – Cllr. Mrs. Osborne expressed her concern at the difficulty in recruiting residents to take part in NW and Cllr Mrs. Winpenny and her husband Gavin asked Iris for details of the scheme.

50. DRAFT BUDGET 2022/23

Council considered the draft budget (attached to the agenda) for 2022/23. Details of the current spend to date were also circulated. In considering the draft budget Members received an assurance from Cllr. Crow-Brown that he would match the grant of £1,000 offered by Cllr. Linda Wright.

RESOLVED: That the budget as attached to the minutes be approved and TDC be advised that the Acol Parish Council require a precept of £9,509.

51. CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk had no further matters to report upon.

52. RECREATION GROUND

Cllr David Hayfield report that fencing for the Recreation Ground was about to be delivered and would be kept in his garden until it was to be erected. Members were also advised that Einar Willett would be welding and repairing the gate to the Rec.
