

#### SURGERY LAUNCHES NEW "GOLD CARD" FACILITY

This is a new initiative designed and produced by your Patient Liaison Group in conjunction with our Frailty Team. The "GOLD CARD" contains a comprehensive list of contacts and telephone numbers that patients, family and friends can immediately refer to in time of a crisis or emergency. It is designed to help those patients with long term, life limiting or life-threatening illnesses, including those suffering from cancer or receiving palliative care, who might need advice, help or support urgently.

The "GOLD CARD" will be handed to patients when visited by our Frailty or District Nursing teams, or you can request one at the surgery. It will be updated regularly, as we all know, things often change! It is also hoped that this will be eventually rolled out across Thanet.
