**A28 CANTERBURY ROAD,
BIRCHINGTON & MARGATE**

(PROHIBITION OF DRIVING)

TEMPORARY ORDER JULY 2019

To allow essential carriageway resurfacing works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on sections of the A28 Canterbury Road between Birchington and Margate.

Phased overnight closures are planned from Monday 8 July 2019 onwards.

Closures are from 19:30 hours through until approximately 05:00 hours each night.

A28 Canterbury Road will be closed in 3 main phases, with the current planned dates as follows

A28 CANTERBURY ROAD, BIRCHINGTON – closures on nights of 8 July to 13 July 2019 inclusive

Closures between the junctions with Quex View Road and Kent Gardens

Alternative route via A299 Thanet Way, Canterbury Road West, Hengist Way, Lord of the Manor Interchange, A256 Haine Road, New Haine Road, A254 Margate Road, Ramsgate Road, B2052 College Road, Hartsdown Road and King George V Avenue

A28 CANTERBURY ROAD, MARGATE – closures nights of 15 July to 22 July inclusive excluding Sunday

Closures between the junctions with Old Crossing Road and George V Avenue

Alternative route as above

A28 MARINE TERRACE, MARGATE – closures nights of 23 July to 1 August inclusive, weekdays only

Alternative route via B2052 King George V Avenue, Hartsdown Road, Beatrice Road, (College Road in opposite direction) B2052 College Road, A255 St Peter's Road, Ramsgate Road, Queen's Avenue, Eaton Road, Belgrave Road, A28 Marine Terrace and Canterbury Road

Various side-roads will be closed at their junctions with the A28 as the works progress, with access to them continuing from their other junctions and signposted diversions.

Personnel will be on site at certain locations to allow managed access for residents when it is safe to do so, but there are likely to be delays and certain times when this is not possible for safety reasons.

Local access to the remainder of A28 Canterbury Road continues from either direction up to where the road is closed at any time, but there will be no through access during these works.

These works are part of an extensive resurfacing programme which is subject to weather and other factors that may potentially cause changes at short notice; every effort will be made to keep as close as possible to the planned dates, and any changes will be publicised.
