An Evening with Reindeer ...

On Saturday 21st December Acol Village Hall Committee will be holding a Reindeer Drive in the Village Hall. It's a Christmas version of a Beetle Drive.

Anyone, any age, is welcome. You can come on your own, with a partner or as a group with friends. Bring your children - if they can add up, they can play (probably better than many of the adults!). If you are on your own or are shy and don't think you know anyone, I guarantee by the end of the evening you will have met, spoken to, and had a giggle with, almost everyone in the Hall. You will also probably shout in frustration at some time during the proceedings.

It goes like this:

It is played at tables of 4. People sitting opposite play as a pair. A Reindeer has been dissected into 8 component parts, the numbers on a dice representing those parts. You then each take it in turns to throw the dice until one table collects enough components to make a whole reindeer - at which point you shout 'REINDEER' The game then stops and the pair with most points move onto the next table. <u>Fibre Broadband Update</u>

Karen Ault and Richard Steel met with George Chandler, KCC's Broadband Project Manager, to discuss the best approach to securing decent broadband service for residents of our village. We are recommending use of the Government's "Broadband Voucher Scheme" as the best means of making true (fibre) broadband provision available to everyone in our community. This Voucher Scheme is available to individuals and businesses who do not have Superfast Broadband Services - defined as of 25 mbps or higher (30 mbps in the rest of the EU). None of us, in Acol, has "Superfast" service availability.

Through the scheme individuals can apply for grants towards the costs of installation of Superfast Broadband services. The grant of, currently, £1,500 per premise, will be supplemented by KCC's own Voucher Scheme of £1,000 per residential premise. If enough of us commit to applying for the vouchers, the grants can be aggregated to fund provision through the Community Partnership Scheme that we previously explored and whose provision for our community was last estimated at £65,000+.

In order to receive the grant, applicants must commit to entering at least a twelve-month contract for a Superfast Broadband service once it's deliverable. If you already subscribe to a broadband service this is unlikely to be onerous; in fact, you may already be subscribing to a fibre service that could deliver superfast speeds in fibre-connected communities but will be receiving far more limited services based-upon our village's outdated copper and aluminium infrastructure. The monthly cost will typically be less than £30. Initially, the number of service providers able to deliver fibre broadband services is quite limited, so it's possible that you would need to switch broadband providers.

We therefore need to survey Acol households to determine whether we can aggregate sufficient demand to commit to a Community Broadband Partnership Scheme (which, based upon what we know of the number of Acol households and current broadband usage, should be readily achievable) that should be deliverable within twelve months of placing an order.

In the coming weeks Karen and Richard will be out in the Village to identify whether there is enough interest for Acol to commit to a Community Broadband Partnership Scheme (which could be deliverable within 12 months of placing an order) and to answer any questions. They will need to gather the following information...

- * Current broadband service provision (if any). Please specify plan name... E.g. "Vodafone Superfast 1".
- * Cost of plan, excluding extras such as telephone service.
- * Present contract expiry date or whether out of contract.
- * Whether a business is registered to your address. (This will increase the voucher value.)
- * Willingness to apply to the Government's Broadband Voucher Scheme and commit to a minimum twelve-month contract for Superfast Broadband service (switching providers, if necessary).

Once Karen and Richard have completed this survey, in conjunction with the Parish Council we'll arrange a public meeting, including the KCC's Broadband Project Manager and the (Openreach) Community Partnership provider to discuss and plan the scheme's delivery.

Editors Note: If you too are fed up with service interruptions, outages and slow internet access, then for no up-front capital outlay this scheme is surely a no brainer. Our thanks to Richard and Keren for their hard work in pulling this together on behalf of the Village.

PREPARING FOR WINTER

There is currently only one Salt Bin in Acol, which is adjacent to the Chapel of Rest in Plumstone Road. The Parish Council have agreed to acquire an additional Bin for Nursery Fields to serve the residents in that area. These bins are filled once each year by TDC. Fortunately, the last two years were so very mild that the existing bin has been hardly needed, and consequently is itself full and a full Jumbo bag of sand/salt mix is sitting forlornly alongside it. Residents are therefore invited to help themselves to the sand/salt mix for de-icing their own drives, paths etc. (they must, of course, provide their own containers/sacks). This needs to be done fairly quickly, as TDC will make a further delivery to both the existing and the new (Nursery Fields) bins in the next few weeks.


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WARNINGS TO RESIDENTS

Thanet residents warned to ensure cold callers are genuine

Don't be afraid to check cold callers are genuine, police are advising residents following a number of recent incidents in Thanet.

It was reported that a man knocked on the door of a property in the Beacon Road area of Broadstairs, selling items including cleaning products from a holdall.

The resident reported that when they declined to buy anything, the man became confrontational and he was verbally abusive before leaving.

A similar report was made by a resident in the Millmead Road area of Margate on the same day.

Kent Police Inspector Jason Brown of Thanet Community Safety Unit said:

'While people who canvass door to door can be genuine, some might not be, and so we advise residents to be cautious about who they open the door to.

'Callers should - at the very least - produce proof of identification which can be traced.

'Do not be afraid to ask them to wait outside or come back later while you call the company supplying the ID card to check.

'Close the door and use the door chain if you have one. If they are genuine callers, they will not mind you doing this.

'If you see anything suspicious taking place in your street, report it to Kent Police on 101 or via the website, or 999 if a crime is taking place.

Advice

Consider fitting extra security measures such as spy holes, door locks and intruder alarms and always check the identity of cold callers. Don't be afraid to turn people away.

Always ensure rear doors and windows are shut and locked when answering your front door.

If you have any doubts about whether a caller is genuine, ask them to leave and come back at a time convenient to you and when you've had a chance to ask someone to be with you. Call police if you suspect cold callers may be bogus
