(TRAFFIC) LIGHT AT THE END OF THE TUNNEL?

A bid for a whopping £49.8 million has been made by Kent County Council for the creation of a relief road at the A28 between Birchington, Acol and Westgate-on-Sea. The bid is part of a list of high-priority road improvement schemes submitted to government as part of a £3.5 billion investment programme. The schemes were agreed by Transport for the South East, a new regional body which brings together local authorities, business groups and the transport industry.

As part of the list, Kent County Council put forward the bid for funding for the relief road between Birchington, Acol and Westgate-on-Sea. The A28 relief road would provide an alternative route, using the existing Shottendane Road which runs south of and parallel to the A28, which would be widened and improved. The new road would link to the A28 south of Birchington and to Manston Road and Hartsdown Road, east of Westgate-on-Sea, through future development sites.

It would also provide a southern link through an extension to the existing Columbus Avenue, providing traffic relief to the village of Acol.

KCC cabinet member for highways Mike Whiting said: "The schemes we have put forward through our work with Transport for the South East will make a big difference to the lives of our residents.

"If funded we can look forward to more reliable, quicker journeys, and help cut congestion whilst supporting new housing, businesses and jobs."

ADVANCE WARNING

We have been advised by UK Power Network that many of the electricity poles and much of the wiring in Acol are rotten and need replacing. This will mean parts of the village will be blacked out whilst the work is carried out.

It will probably happen in September, but they have promised to give plenty of notice before the work is due to commence.

WARNINGS TO RESIDENTS

Action Fraud has received 63 reports about a scam in which fraudsters target people with offers of "low cost" loans or "free" government grants. What the victims aren't told is that the money they'll receive is actually an advance payment for Universal Credit. The criminals use the personal information they've obtain under false pretences to make an application in the victim's name. After the fraudsters have taken their "fee" from the advance payment, the victim is then left to pay back the total amount once their repayments begin.

How you can protect yourself:

- Never share your personal or financial information with someone you don't know and trust, especially if it's in response to an offer of "free money" or a "free grant".
- Department for Work & Pensions (DWP) staff will never approach you in the street or ask for your personal/financial details over social media.
- If you have concerns about your benefits, you should visit www.gov.uk/contactjobcentre-plus
- If you suspect your identity may have been stolen, you can check your credit rating quickly and easily online. You should do this every few months anyway, using a reputable service provider and following up on any unexpected or suspicious results.

FIBRE BROADBAND - an Update on Progress from Richard Steel

Although modelling work by BT Openreach has taken longer than expected, progress is slowly being made and there is now a contract in place for full fibre roll-out in Acol. Precise details of what will be provided, and the timescales for delivery, have yet to be finalised, but it's looking like our roll-out should take place around the end of next year.

Meantime, we continue to hear all sorts of stories of poor and intermittent broadband services from villagers and can only advise that you complain on every occasion to your service providers. The state of our existing network, based as it is on Aluminium wiring to many residences, is such that no regular maintenance is attempted for fear of unsettling our flaky infrastructure so, unless you complain, faults will not be fixed!

OVERGROWN VEGETATION OBSTRUCTING THE HIGHWAY/PAVEMENTS

Kent County Council is the Highways Authority, and is responsible bfor ensuring that highways and pavements are not obstructed and can be used safely. The County Council has released the following guidance notes, and you will note that they have powers to take legal action to ensure that the Highways and Pavements are kept clear and to recover any costs from the owners of offending properties as appropriate.

"We have an obligation to ensure private property owners cut back any hedges, vegetation or shrubs that encroach onto the highway. We require private property owners to:

- Cut back any vegetation from streetlights to allow the full beam of light to shine on the ground
- Ensure the full width of the footpath is available for use by pedestrians
- Provide a minimum of 2.4 metres of clearance above the footpath
- Provide a minimum of 5.2 metres of clearance above the carriageway which continues 50cm past the edge of the carriageway to allow for growth

Kent County Council may take legal steps to ensure these obligations are complied with, costs being recovered from the property owner."
